DECISIONS OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF NRAI DURING ITS MEETING HELD ON 3RD DECEMBER 2021

1. To introduce new Matches on the Program of NSCC:

Free Pistol for Women Standard Pistol for Junior Women

For participation in above events, shooters who are eligible to participate in any one event at the National Championship (i.e. if they are eligible to participate in the APW or SPW event) they would be permitted to participate in these events. However to be declared as "Renowned Shots " they would be required to achieve the MQS as stated in 17.6. These events will not be conducted during AIGVMSC/ZONAL Championships.

2. Introduction of new age category as Masters for the shooters in age group 45-60

A new Category of shooters aged between 45-60 years is introduced "Masters". Shooters between the age of 45-60 can participate under this category. These shooters are required to achieve MQS, as per Table under 17.6 of NRAI Match Book, to be notified as renowned shooter under this category. The shooters of this category are also permitted to participate in Senior category.

3. The nomenclature of Veteran Shooters category is changed to Senior Masters for shooters above the age of 60 years. The Seniors Masters can participate in Masters category and matches for Seniors.

4. To consider bifurcation of conduct of Rifle and Pistol events of AIGVMSC at different venues.

In view of the large number of shooters participating in Rifle and Pistol events during AIGVMSC and number of days involved for the conduct of this event, it has been decided to bifurcate Rifle and Pistol events and these events be conducted at two different venues. The ranges, which can handle large number of shooters and with easy access, will be allotted the conduct of these events.

5. It was decided to permit shooters to participate in any or all Rifle / Pistol / Shot Gun / Big Bore Rifle events, subject of achieving MQS for respective competitions, at the Zonal / AIGVMSC and the Nationals. However NO concession would be made for detail allotment and overlapping of events. The NRAI would not make any concessions for shooters who had overlapping matches due to participation in more than one stream / section of shooting. Also shooters who are members of the NSQ or participate in any Open Selection Trial would not be permitted to participate in more than one stream/section (Rifle, Pistol or Shotgun) in the selection trials or would not be members of the NQS in more than one stream / section.

6. The following amendments have been carried out in NRAI Match Book and NRAI Match Book 2018 (amended) will be NRAI Match Book 2022:

1.2	Sub Youth/Youth/Junior shooters can take part in higher category matches subject to achieving MQS as fixed under their age category under Rule 1.4 of NRAI Match Book.
1.6.1	Shooters, who have achieved MQS as per Rule 17.6 of NRAI Match Book during AIGVMSC/ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIP/INTER SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIP will be allowed to participate in next NSCC provided scores achieved by them in AIGVMSC/ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS/INTER SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIP are not older than two years. If such shooter who has achieved MQS in the above competitions and has not already participated in an NSCC based on that qualification then the above rule would apply. Once a shooter participates in the NSCC in that event then the scores shot in the above competition become redundant. S/he can go the next NSCC only if s/ he has achieved the required MQS at the NSCC or will have to go back to the above competitions to achieve the required MQS again.
1.8	For the purpose of a shooting year, stated under these rules: Beginning from the first day of NSCC to the first day of next NSCC - will be one shooting calendar year.
6.6	Shooters desirous of representing another state/unit must take a NOC from their parent State/unit. Change of State/Unit is permitted between 1 st of February to 30th of September every year and after that no shooter is allowed to change his/her State/Unit except shooter who wish to change the State on account of joining/retiring from a Govt. job/sponsorship. The NCC cadets joining or leaving the Organization may change their State at the time of joining/leaving the Organization subject to obtaining NOC from the State/DG NCC. No NOC will be accepted, after the date of issue of Circular of the Competition.
6.6.1	The Affiliated unit, at the time of issue NOC to a shooter during February – September, must send copy of NOC immediately to NRAI through email for its record. In absence of this, NOC will not be accepted.
6.6.2	The change of State fee is fixed as Rs. 1500/- plus GST, as applicable.
11.1	Juniors/Youth/Sub Youth are the athletes, who will be under the age of 21/19/16 years on the first day of the commencement of the NSCC/Competition/Selection Trial in the year of the competition, will be eligible to participate in junior/ Youth/Sub Youth category matches. This rule will be linked to the ISSF rules and any amendment by the ISSF will automatically affect this rule and the new prevailing rule will apply.
11.2	Persons above the age of 60 years, on the first day of the NSCC/Competition, can take part in veteran category matches now known as Senior Masters - subject to achieving scores as per rule 1.4 and 17.6.
	Persons above the age of 45 years and below the age of 60 years (45-60 years), on the first day of the NSCC/Competition can take part in Masters category matches subject to achieving scores as per rule 1.4 and 17.6.

11.3	For any recognised competition the minimum age for participation in fire arms
	events is 12 and 10 for air gun events. ONLY a competitor who has completed the
	age of 12 years (for Fire arms events)/10 years (for Air Gun events on the first day of the competition including state / zonal / AIGVMSC or any other
	competition recognised by the NRAI will be permitted to participate in

11.4	Transit shooters (junior/youth/sub youth) will be permitted to participate in the next NSCC, if they have achieved the requisite MQS of their present category. This relaxation of rule will apply only for the immediately ensuing NSCC In the case that such transit shooter is unable to participate in the ensuing NSCC then s/ he would be required to participate in Zonal Championship/AIGVMSC to achieve

17.7	1. RFP – 1 st entry into NSCC : A shooter of CFP / Std P / SP jr. M who has achieved the below scores in any one of the events in the previous NSCC such shooter may participate in the RFP event at the NSCC. 2. Once a shooter has shot the RFP event at the NSCC and has achieved the MQS required as per 17.6, he would be eligible to shoot the RFP event in the next NSCC. If he fails to achieve the requisite MQS then he would have to take a break in next NSCC and re-enter for the RFP event as per clause 1 above.

17.7.1	A shooter who has achieved the following scores in the Rapid Fire Stage (duelling) of the Sport Pistol Event at the preceding NSCC and is also eligible to participate in the Open Selection Trials; will be eligible to participate in the selection trials for the RFPW event. These trials will be conducted solely for the selection of the team for the RFP Mixed event at International competitions and no other purpose. Sports Pistol (W)

- 7. MQS under Rule 17.6 of NRAI Match Book 2018 (amended) shall be the basis of notifying the participants of 64 NSCC as Renowned shot but entry point for participation in 65 NSCC shall be the MQS as per Chart attached, which was published prior to start of 64 NSCC.
- 8. It is decided that Aadhar Card number will be mandatory for shooters applying for Shooter ID. The applicant must upload copy of Aadhar Card with other documents, as required under present norms. The existing ID Card holders must attach copy of Aadhar Card and enter Aadhar Card number at the time of renewing the same.
- 9. Start of an annual competition in memory of Late Shri Digvijay Singh in Shotgun events.

An annual competition in shotgun events will be started in memory of late Shri Digvijay Singh, former President of NRAI. The norms for this competitions are as under:

The Competition to be named as "SHRI DIGVIJAY SINGH MEMORIAL SHOOTING COMPETITION (SHOTGUN)"

This will be conducted annually in Senior and Junior Men and Women categories as per ISSF Rules after the conclusion of NSCC. Events in Individual, team, Mix Team and TEAM events.

Shooters, who achieve MQS under 17.6 of NRAI Match Book, in latest NSCC will be permitted to participate in this Competition.

This Competition will be conducted in accordance with rules under NRAI Match Book and ISSF Rules.

Scores of this Competition shall be considered for the purpose of average under Selection Policy for Shotgun.
